Rugby School Japan (RSJ) Summer Programme 2022 Programme Master

The RSJ Summer Programme Master reports to the CEA Team and alongside the CEA team is responsible for leadership, supervision, instruction, & implementation of all aspects of the RSJ North Peak Summer Programme 2022.

The main function of this role is to ensure that each pupil, team member and guest receives the highest calibre of programme, service and care.

Professional Responsibilities

- Lead the overall running of all aspects of the RSJ summer programme.
- Ensure all aspects of safeguarding policy are implemented and observed.
- Prepare the programme plan and provide supervision, instruction, and ongoing assistance to programme staff, students and parents
- Oversee the pupil registration process, preparation and management of paperwork including medical, travel, dietary and insurance documentation
- Establish good rapport with families of the programme participants as well as keep them informed. Be a point of reference.
- Work with CEAPS team to ensure all travel arrangements are in place
- Ensure all programme equipment & supplies are ordered and in place before the programme starts
- Liaise with the summer school cooks, ensuring all dietary requirements are met.
- Ensure a good understanding of all safety rules and emergency procedures and share these with all programme staff and pupils at the outset of each weekly programme.
- Manage behaviour positively.
- Administer all medical protocol as directed
- Coordinate the care, cleanliness, and security of the facility during the programme.
- Communicate clearly, honestly and respectfully to staff, pupils and parents in a timely manner.
- Implement all health and safety policies and procedures
- Participate in all required training & certifications in compliance with North Peak standards.
- Create a nurturing, positive and professional environment while promoting programme policies and procedures amongst the team and community.
- Report to the Programme Director at the end of every day
- Keep a reflective daily written record of each day.

- Be fluent in both written and spoken English and (where possible) Japanese
- Commit to contracted dates in July and August with a willingness to contribute to programme preparation beforehand

- Commitment to a positive, fun and team-oriented working environment
- An understanding that this role requires a commitment beyond regular contracted hours
